



very high level of duty of care and are liable if any one is hurt or injured because of the sub-standard state of the building.

Cllr Hooper asked if anyone had any suggestions for the future of the building. There then followed a long debate on the possibilities that were open to the Parish Council and the Football Club. A lot of ideas were discussed.

As the debate drew to a close it was suggested by Cllr Kenton that as a short term solution, the Parish Council may be able to “give” the Pavilion to the football club. The Club would then be responsible for its upkeep and undertaking the necessary repairs. However as a club they would be able to take advantage of the skills possessed by members this would reduce the cost of the repairs. The Club would also have access to grant funding that may not be available to the Council.

In the long term a new building would however be needed. To this end the Parish Council would apply for outline planning permission for a new Pavilion.

If it was not possible to give the Pavilion to the Football Club it may be possible for a temporary building to be put on the site until funding for a new Pavilion could be obtained. The Committee did however point out that without the full support and involvement of the Football club, the Parish Council would be unable to progress with this project and the existing Pavilion would have to be demolished.

It was agreed that the matter would be considered by the next football club committee meeting and that the Allotments Committee would make recommendations to the next meeting of the Parish Council.
